





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We have had a great term focusing on relationships across the whole school. Year 2H

In year 2 this half term our topic has been 'Ocean Commotion.' Over the last couple of weeks in our English lessons we have been reading The Rainbow Fish. From this story we have been writing our own innovated stories using expanded noun phrases.

Our Geography focus has been identifying the oceans of the world. We revisited what we knew about British seas and have looked at the human and physical features of popular seaside places in the UK. We then compared a British beach with one from another country.



In our science lessons we have been growing seeds and observing them grow. From this we set up a simple test to show what plants need to grow well.



We then predicted what we thought would happen and recorded our findings.



Year 3M

This has been a very busy term for year 3. We have studied the artist Banksy and created our own sculptures with clay! In Maths we have been learning about 2D and 3D shapes and made our own shapes to help identify their properties. We have investigated forces and magnets in science and carried out fair tests. We have also enjoyed roleplays in come and see when learning about the Holy Spirit. In History we have been looking at the history of Liverpool and even got the opportunity to go on a field trip to visit the museum of Liverpool and the Albert Docks.

Year 4L

Year 4 have had a busy half term learning about sound in science and mountains in geography. We have enjoyed reading our story Farther in English and have wrote our own journey tale and instructions. We maths, we are learning how to tell the time and it is important to keep practising this at home. We had lots of fun evaluating and making our own pizzas in DT.



Year 5L

5L have worked hard this half term developing their knowledge of measure, writing letters and writing from different perspectives, developing their athletics skills and learning about the Mediterranean. However, the favourite activity has to be helping the local community by planting seeds on Park Road.



Year 6D

In Year 6, we have worked extremely hard and have now completed our SATs - with all of us trying our very best. We also finally completed our T Shirt designs in DT. In history lessons, we have learnt all about the misery of the transatlantic slave trade and begun to look at the role which Liverpool played in the slave trade triangle.



Year 5ML Y5 have enjoyed evaluating and designing their own Mediterranean food. Some of the children were pleasantly surprised to find that they like some of the foods that they didn't think they would like, such as, roasted peppers, onions and courgettes. In English, the children have been engrossed in A Series of Unfortunate Events: The Bad Beginning. In maths, they have developed their ability to calculate the perimeter and area of compound shapes.
